We are looking forward to a fun filled term full of opportunities to reach high and grow together.

Area of Development	This half term our topic is <u>'Local Area'</u>
Communication, Language, Reading and Writing	<p>Each week, the children in Early Years will be taking part in activities associated with the topic of 'Local Area'.</p> <p>We will be looking at the following topics:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Go Jettors • Ducks (featuring some very special guests!) • Science Week • Mr Busy's Post • Where we live • Easter <p>We are continuing with the daily phonics activities. The children will develop their speaking, listening and memory skills. The children will take part in lots of writing and activities associated with our topic. If your child does any writing at home, please bring it in as we would love to see it or pop a picture on Tapestry.</p>
Mathematics	<p>The children will take part in lots of number activities involving number recognition, composition of numbers, number bonds to 5, addition and subtraction problems, ordering numbers, doubling, sharing, counting activities, problem solving, subitising, estimating and shape and space activities. Children will also use everyday language to talk about size, weight, capacity, positions distance, time and money to compare quantities and objects and to solve problems. We will continue consolidating the children's number recognition with Ten Town on the interactive whiteboard.</p>
Personal, Social and Emotional Development	<p>We continuously encourage the children to develop independence and key skills to help them throughout the rest of their school journey.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Forming friendships with children • Sharing toys • Taking turns • Manners (saying please and thank you) • Managing feelings and behaviour • Listening to children and adults • Developing the confidence to talk in front of others • Washing hands • Tidying up
Understanding the World	<p>Our Topic this half term will enable the children to develop their knowledge and understanding in lots of areas including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Thinking about where they live and the special places around us – our home, school, park, shops etc. • Enjoying playing with small-world models • Commenting and asking questions about aspects of their familiar world such as the place where they live or the natural world. • Technology by using iPads, Interactive Whiteboards, computers and bee-bots. • Observing and investigating our indoor and outdoor environment. • Talk about some of the things they have observed such as plants, animals, natural and found objects. • Shows care and concern for living things and the environment. • We will also access a range of indoor activities that will develop the children's observation skills through games and discussion. • Continuing to investigate change, patterns, similarities and why things happen and how things work. • Know about similarities and differences in relation to places, objects, materials and living things. • Testing materials • The children will have a French lesson each week. This will be taught by Mrs.

Expressive Arts and Design	The children will sing songs and have the opportunity to compose pieces of music with instruments related to our topics, be imaginative, play cooperatively to develop and act out narratives. Paints, pastels, crayons, and other mark making materials and art equipment will be available every day for the children to use. The children will have a music lesson each week.
Physical Development	The children will use the following pieces of equipment to develop their fine motor and gross motor skills <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Play dough and other malleable materials • Jigsaws, threading, finger gym activities • Scissors and glue • Mark making materials • Play various playground games. • Climbing Frame and tunnels. • Scooters and bikes • Obstacle courses • Bats and balls • Hoops and beanbags • Wooden and plastic blocks <p>The children will also learn about self-care:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Washing their hands regularly and how germs are spread • Learn to use tissues- catch it, kill it, bin it
