Outdoor Play & Sun Protection

As the weather begins to get warmer, we would like to ask parents/carers to ensure children bring appropriate clothing to school for outdoor play. Sun hats should be clearly labelled with your child's name. Our outdoor area gets very hot and sunny so an 'all-day' sun cream should be applied before children come to school. We are unable to apply sun cream on your child.

Home Learning & Tapestry

All home learning will be sent out via email and should be completed using the Tapestry app. If you have trouble accessing Tapestry, please speak to a member of staff. It's important that all parents have access to this wonderful app as you will receive regular updates about your child, and it is an excellent platform for submitting home learning.

School uniform

Please ensure your child wears the correct uniform which is clearly labelled with your child's name. Children must wear a tie, a shirt with pointed collars, a school jumper or cardigan with the logo on, grey trousers/skirt/pinafore and plain black school shoes.

Toys, scooters & bikes

Toys and teddies must not be brought into school. Please can we also remind you that in the interests of safety, if your child comes to school on a bicycle, scooter, or any other child's vehicle they must dismount the item when they arrive at the gate and lock it in the cycle store (located on the main school playground). Please be aware that the main school gates will be locked and won't re-open until 3:25pm. Alternatively, scooters and bikes can be handed to the parent/carer to take home for safe keeping. Unfortunately, we are unable to store scooters and bikes in our nursery playground for safety reasons. Thank you.
