Best ways to support writing at home

Provide a place for your child to write

The area should be an area that is quiet and well lit. Stock the "writing centre" with supplies such as paper, pencils and crayons. You can also gather family photos and magazines in the centre that can be used as story starters.



Read, read, read The best activity to improve writing is reading. If your child reads good books, they will be a better writer. Reading exposes students to general vocabulary, word study and content-specific vocabulary. Through reading, students see a variety of authors' techniques that they can use in their own writing.

Provide writing opportunities for your child Have your child write their own thank-you notes, party invitations and letters to family. Let your child make the grocery list. Helping children make the connection between writing and the "real" world will increase an interest in writing.
