Early Years

We are looking forward to a fun filled term full of opportunities to reach high and grow together.

Area of Development	This half term our topic is <u>'Homes and Dens'</u>
Communication, Language, Reading and Writing	<p>Each week, the children in Early Years will be taking part in activities associated with this half terms topic 'Homes and Dens'.</p> <p>We will look at a variety of different stories including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The three little pigs • There's a Rang-Tan in my bedroom. • A good place • All kinds of homes • The house that wanted a family • This is our house. <p>During this term we will also be taking part in lots of different activities during Sports Week.</p> <p>The children will take part in daily phonics sessions in small groups. They will develop their speaking, listening, concentration and memory skills through playing games and taking part in activities. Please remember to share any mark making, drawings or writing your child does at home by popping a photo on to Tapestry. We'd love to see what they have been getting busy with at home.</p>
Mathematics	<p>Each week, the children will take part in lots of number activities involving number recognition, counting activities, problem solving, shape and space activities, numeral recognition and begin to look at simple addition. We also sing lots of number songs and play counting games.</p> <p>Our adult led activities are always linked to our stories and topics so this term we will spend time looking at door numbers, counting house and building with different 3D shapes. We will discuss what we are doing encouraging the use of mathematic vocabulary in our play.</p> <p>We also enjoy meeting the various characters from 10 Town, listening to their story and song and playing lots of interactive games on the whiteboard.</p>
Personal, Social and Emotional Development	<p>We continuously encourage the children to develop independence and key skills to help them throughout the rest of their school journey.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Forming friendships with others • Sharing toys • Taking turns • Manners (saying please and thank you) • Managing feelings and behaviour • Listening to children and adults • Developing the confidence to talk in front of others • Washing hands • Using the toilet with increasing independence • Getting dressed and undressed independently • We will also spend time preparing our older children for the move up to Reception in September.
Understanding the World	<p>Our topics will enable the children to-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Think about where we live and the different types of homes around us. • Enjoys playing with small-world models • Comments and asks questions about aspects of their familiar world such as the place where they live or the natural world. • Talk about some of the things they have observed such as plants, animals, natural and found objects. • Talk about why things happen and how things work. • Developing an understanding of growth, decay and changes over time. • Looks closely at similarities, differences, patterns and change • Complete ICT programmes using iPads, cameras, computers and bee-bots. • Learn about different homes around the world.
Expressive Arts and Design	<p>The children will sing songs and have the opportunity to compose pieces of music with instruments related to our topics, be imaginative, play cooperatively to develop and act out</p>

	narratives. Paints, pastels, crayons, and other mark making materials and art equipment will be available every day for the children to use.
Physical Development	<p>The children will use the following pieces of equipment to develop their fine motor and gross motor skills</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Play dough and other malleable materials • Jigsaws, threading, finger gym activities • Scissors and glue • Mark making materials • Play various playground games. • Climbing Frame and tunnels. • Scooters and bikes • Obstacle courses • Bats and balls • Hoops and beanbags • Wooden and plastic blocks <p>The children will also learn about self-care:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Washing their hands regularly and how germs are spread • Learn to use tissues- catch it, kill it, bin it • Using the toilet with increasing independence • Getting dressed and undressed independently

Outdoor Play

As the days begin to get warmer could we please remind you to ensure your child brings a named sun hat to school and that they arrive to school wearing factor 50 sun cream.

Please be aware that the main school gates will be locked and won't re-open until 3:25pm. Alternatively, scooters and bikes can be handed to the parent/carer to take home for safe-keeping. Unfortunately, we are unable to store scooters and bikes in our nursery playground for safety reasons. Thank you.
