Area of Development	This half term our topic is <u>'Dens and Homes'</u> .
Communication, Language, Reading and Writing	<p>The children in Early Years will be taking part in lots of speaking and listening, reading, and writing activities associated with the following books:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Three Little Pigs • There's a Rang-Tan in my bedroom. • A good place • All kinds of homes • The house that wanted a family • This is our house. <p>During the half term we will also be taking part in lots of different activities during Sports Week.</p> <p>We are continuing with the daily phonics activities. The children will develop their speaking, listening and memory skills. The children will take part in lots of writing and activities associated with our topic. If your child does any writing at home, please bring it in as we would love to see it or pop a picture on Tapestry for us to share.</p>
Mathematics	<p>The children will continue to take part in and revise lots of number activities involving number recognition, ordering numbers, odd and even numbers, number bonds, composition of numbers, writing numbers to 20, subitising, counting activities, problem solving, doubling, halving and shape activities. Children will also use everyday language to talk about size, weight, capacity, positions distance, time and money to compare quantities and objects and to solve problems.</p> <p>Some of our adult led activities will be linked to our stories.</p>
Personal, Social and Emotional Development	<p>We continuously encourage the children to develop independence and key skills to help them throughout the rest of their school journey.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Forming friendships with children • Sharing toys • Manners (saying please and thank you) • Managing feelings and behaviour • Listening to children and adults • Developing confidence when talking in front of others • Self-confidence and self-awareness • Regular hand washing • Developing resilience and a 'can do attitude' • Mrs Redhead teaches a whole class session on Personal, Social and Emotional Development per week. • We have circle time activities each week to help support child's social and emotional development.
Understanding the World	<p>During our topics, the children will learn about:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Family customs and routines. • Enjoys playing with small-world models. • Comments and asks questions about aspects of their familiar world such as the place where they live or the natural world. • Taking increased notice of the change of seasons. • Talk about some of the things they have observed such as plants, animals, natural and found objects. • Talk about why things happen and how things work. • Developing an understanding of growth, decay and changes over time. • Looks closely at similarities, differences, patterns and change

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Testing Materials. • Completing ICT programmes • Using iPads • Children understanding that a range of technology is used in places such as homes and schools. • French - Mrs Redhead teaches the class French each week.
Expressive Arts and Design	The children will continue to sing songs and have the opportunity to compose pieces of music with instruments related to our topics, be imaginative, play cooperatively to develop and act out narratives. Paints, pastels, crayons, and other mark making materials and art equipment will be available every day for the children to use.
Physical Development	<p>The children will use the following pieces of equipment to develop their fine motor and gross motor skills:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Play dough and other malleable materials • Scissors and glue • Mark making materials • Play various playground games • Climbing Frame and tunnel • Scooters and bikes • Obstacle courses • Bats and balls • Hoops and beanbags • Wooden and plastic blocks <p>They will also learn about self-care:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Washing their hands regularly and how germs are spread • Learn to use tissues- catch it, kill it, bin it • Using the toilet with increasing independence • Getting dressed and undressed independently • Road safety and how to keep safe as we walk around our local area

Outdoor Play

As the weather begins to get warmer, we would like to ask parents/carers to ensure children bring appropriate clothing to school for outdoor play. Sun hats should be clearly labelled with your child's name. Our outdoor area gets very hot and sunny so an 'all-day' sun cream should be applied before children come to school. We are unable to apply sun cream on your child.

Home Learning & Tapestry

All home learning will be sent out via email on a Monday. Please submit all home learning via the Tapestry app by the following Monday. If you have trouble accessing Tapestry, please speak to a member of staff. It's important that all parents have access to this wonderful app.

Water bottles

Please provide a named bottle with plain tap water for your child to access whenever needed throughout the day.

School uniform

Please ensure your child wears the correct uniform which is clearly labelled with your child's name. Children must wear a tie, a shirt with pointed collar, a school jumper or cardigan with the logo on, grey trousers/skirt/pinafore and plain black school shoes.

P.E.

We have PE on **Tuesdays and Fridays**. Your child must come to school in their PE clothes.

Toys, scooters & bikes

Toys and teddies must not be brought into school. Please can we also remind you that in the interests of safety, if your child comes to school on a bicycle, scooter, or any other child's vehicle they must dismount the item when they arrive at the gate and lock it in the cycle store (located on the main school playground). Please be aware that the main school gates will be locked and won't re-open until 3:25pm. Alternatively, scooters and bikes can be handed to the parent/carer to take home for safe keeping. Unfortunately, we are unable to store scooters and bikes in our nursery playground for safety reasons. Thank you.
